

THIS MATTER having come before the Washington State Liquor Control Board (Board) pursuant to RCW 66.08.150(4), and the Board having reviewed the materials submitted by the Washington State Liquor Control Board Enforcement Division in this matter, now hereby enters the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Emergency Order of Suspension:

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

12 II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

13 2.1 The Washington State Liquor Act, contained in Title 66 RCW, and the duly
14 promulgated Revised Rules and Regulations of the Board, contained in Title 314 WAC, were
15 created for the protection of the welfare, health, peace, morals, and safety of the people of the
16 state of Washington. *See* RCW 66.08.010.

17 2.2 Pursuant to RCW 66.08.150(4), the Board may summarily suspend a liquor
18 license for a period of up to one-hundred eighty (180) days, without a prior hearing, when the
19 Board finds that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires emergency action.

20 2.3 The Board, after reviewing the foregoing materials, and being in the premises fully
21 advised, concludes that the incidents occurring on the above-identified licensed premises are
22 contrary to public policy and law, and hereby finds that the public health, safety and/or welfare
23 imperatively requires emergency action.

24 NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the Board's emergency powers as authorized by
25 RCW 66.08.150(4), **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DIRECTED:**
26

1 I. That the liquor license privileges of IGNACIO MARTINEZ d/b/a MARTINEZ
2 SPORTS BAR, located at 116 West 2nd Street in Wapato, Washington, are hereby suspended for
3 a period of up to one-hundred eighty (180) days, effective from April 7, 2015, at 6:00 p.m. until
4 October 4, 2015, at 6:00 p.m.

5 II. That the liquor license privileges of IGNACIO MARTINEZ d/b/a MARTINEZ
6 SPORTS BAR be thereafter revoked, subject to any lawful appeal exercised by the licensee.

The purpose of this memo is to recommend an emergency suspension and revocation of the Spirits Beer/Wine Restaurant Lounge liquor license number 350787 issued to Ignacio Martinez, sole proprietor of Martinez Sport's Bar located at 116 West 2nd Street, Wapato WA 98951-1368.

On August 14, 2014, Administrative Law Judge Kim issued an Initial Order revoking Mr. Martinez's liquor license for the Martinez Sports Bar based upon a fourth minor violation within a two-year window. Judge Kim dismissed two disorderly conduct violations based upon his legal analysis of the conduct and whether it occurred within the licensed premises. Both sides petitioned the Board for review of Judge Kim's Initial Order, and on January 13, 2015, the Board issued its Final Order in the consolidated cases affirming the revocation for the four minor violations, but also concluding that the two disorderly conduct violations were also established and provided additional support for the license revocation. Mr. Martinez appealed the Board's decision, and that appeal is currently pending in Yakima County Superior Court. Mr. Martinez has also moved to stay the revocation order, and that motion is also pending before the Yakima County Superior Court. That motion will be heard on April 17, 2015, and unless the Court grants the stay, the revocation order will be enforceable against Mr. Martinez.

In addition to the revocation order already pending against Mr. Martinez, he and his employees have continued to commit additional violations, including those described below:

On February 18, 2015 Lieutenant Williams and Officer DeLeon were advised by the Wapato Police Department of a DUI arrest made at 0035 on February 14, 2015 of Octaviano Sanchez Garcia DOB 11/30/94 (20 years of age). Garcia admitted to drinking at Martinez Sport's Bar that evening. An investigation determined Garcia had been at Martinez Sport's Bar on a previous occasion, February 7, 2015, as he was asked to assist his friend, Jeffrey A. Delarosa DOB 5/7/92, with security. Delarosa determined Garcia was a minor and told him to leave. At approximately 2000 on February 13, 2015 Garcia returned to Martinez Sport's Bar. He admitted to consuming five Corona's, an alcoholic beverage,

from a bucket but couldn't recall the exact number of beers he consumed prior to being asked to leave around 0000.

On March 13, 2015 Wapato Police responded to a call-for-service at Martinez Sport's Bar. The victim, **VictimID** girlfriend of Martinez, stated Martinez threw a bottle of water on her. Martinez was arrested/charged with Domestic Violence and Resisting Arrest. The investigation into this case led to a discovery of lewd conduct occurring multiple times between December 2014 and March 12, 2015, involving Martinez and an employee while inside the premises.. A female bartender alleged that Mr. Martinez had forced her to perform sexual acts on him several times inside the bar.

Officer DeLeon was able to interview **VictimID** and the two witnesses to the domestic violence case as well as the employee involved in the lewd conduct with Martinez. Due to a language barrier, Officer DeLeon conducted the interviews in Spanish. The interviews were recorded and are available. See the reports of the witness interviews attached to this memorandum.

Licensing and Education History

 - This is an educational visit
- April 10, 2012 — Martinez and staff attended a Responsible Liquor Sales class
- October 10, 2012 — Martinez and staff were invited to attend a community-wide Responsible Liquor Sales class. Nobody from Martinez Sport's Bar attended.

Between January 2013 and today, the Enforcement Division issued **three Group 1 Public Safety Administrative Violation Notices (AVN)**. **Two of the AVNs, along with three Public Safety AVNs from 2012, are awaiting review in Yakima Superior Court.**

On February 14, 2015 Wapato Police Officer Deccio stopped a vehicle for suspicion of DUI. During the investigation it was determined that Octaviano Sanchez Garcia (DOB 11-30-94), age 20, had frequented the restricted premises and possessed and consumed alcohol. Garcia was arrested and booked into jail with a BAC of .203. Officer DeLeon and I conducted an investigation. Garcia said that he was in the premises from approximately 2000 until 2330. He consumed five bottles of Corona beer. At approximately 2330 he left the premises and was stopped for DUI.

Jeffrey Delarosa, security guard, was also interviewed. Delarosa said that he saw Garcia in the premises at approximately 2000 and kicked him out. At some point Garcia went back into the premises. Delarosa noticed Garcia was drinking alcohol at approximately 2200. Delarosa said that Garcia was cut off from alcohol service because he was showing signs of intoxication. Delarosa said that Garcia had shown a drivers license stating he was over 21 on a previous visit.

On March 18, 2015 Officer DeLeon received Wapato Police Report #15W0490 detailing an assault which occurred in the licensed premises on March 13, 2015. The licensee, Ignacio Martinez, assaulted his girlfriend, **VictimID** with a bottle of water. Martinez was upset with **VictimID** and deliberately threw water on her. **VictimID** was scared of Martinez because he had assaulted her before in the bar. Wapato police responded to the location when she called 9-1-1. After telling Martinez that he was under arrest, Wapato Police had to fight with him as he resisted arrest. Martinez was booked into Wapato City Jail.

While investigating the assault, Officer DeLeon became aware of allegations that Martinez had vaginally raped an employee, **VictimID** and forced her to perform oral sex on him on three separate occasions in the licensed premises.

Currently, Martinez has six Administrative Violation Notices (AVN) issued against him. Five of the violations have been through the administrative process, including formal

hearings, and are now scheduled for a hearing in Yakima Superior Court requesting injunctive relief from the penalties.

On November 13, 2013, AVN #4D3305A was issued after Martinez assaulted **VictimID** in the premises. An Emergency Closure was implemented. No hearing was held during the emergency closure period so Martinez was allowed to reopen.


I, Rufino DeLeon, make the following Declaration of my own personal knowledge under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Washington.

314.11.050; 314.11.015(2);

314.11.050: Lewd Conduct: Engaging In or Permitting Conduct in Violation of WAC 314-11-050 -- (1) Licensees may not allow, permit, or encourage employees (including him or herself) to: (a) Be unclothed or in such attire, costume, or clothing as to expose to view any portion of the breast below the top of the areola or of any portion of the pubic hair, anus, cleft of the buttocks, vulva, or genitals. (2) Licensees may not allow, permit, or encourage any person (including him or herself) on the licensed premises to: (a) Perform acts of or acts which simulate, or use artificial devices or inanimate objects which depict: • Sexual intercourse, masturbation, sodomy, bestiality, oral copulation, flagellation, or any sexual acts which are prohibited by law; • The touching, caressing, or fondling of the breast, buttocks, anus or genitals; or • The displaying of the pubic hair, anus, vulva, or genitals. (b) Show any film, still picture, electronic reproduction, or other visual reproduction that depicts pornography, or a sexual act prohibited by law. (3) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (4) of this rule, licensees may not encourage any person on the licensed premises to: (a) Expose to public view any portion of his or her genitals or anus; (b) Touch, caress, or fondle the breasts, buttocks, anus, or genitals of any other person; or (c) Wear or use any device or covering that is exposed to view which simulates the breast, genitals, anus, pubic hair, or any portion thereof. (4) Licensees must ensure any entertainers on the licensed premises perform under the following guidelines: (a) Entertainers may only expose their breast and/or buttocks if the performer(s) is on a stage at least eighteen inches above the immediate floor level and removed at least six feet from the nearest patron. (b) Performers must be at least six feet away from the nearest patron. This restriction will not be applied to performances of traditional ethnic dancing, provided that all of the following conditions are met: (i) The dancers are compensated by the licensee; (ii) At all times, the licensee must maintain and have available for inspection by any liquor enforcement officer a list of all traditional ethnic dancers employed at the licensed premises. The list must be retained for a period of thirty days after termination of employment and must contain the following information for each dancer or entertainer: • True name and professional or stage name, if any; • Residence address and phone number; • Terms of the agreement of employment; and • Signature of both the licensee and the dancer or entertainer; (iii) The traditional or ethnic dance performances will be those performed for the enjoyment of the general audience of the licensee and not for individual patrons. (5) The occurrence of any of the above acts or conduct, whether permitted by a licensee, employee, or any other person under the control or direction of the licensee or an employee, constitutes good and sufficient cause for cancellation of license privileges. (6) Nothing in this rule is intended disallow local officials from adopting ordinances that are more restrictive than the requirements outlined in this rule. (7) If any provision of this rule or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or application of the rule which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this rule are severable. 314.11.015(2): Conduct Violations: (Criminal or Disorderly / Licensee or Employee Drinking / Intoxicated on Premises) -- (2) Licensees and their employees also have the responsibility to conduct the licensed premises in compliance with the following laws, as they now exist or may later be amended: Titles 9 and 9A RCW, the criminal code laws; Title 69 RCW, which outlines the laws regarding controlled substances; and Titles 70.155, 82.24 RCW, and RCW 26.28.080 which outline laws regarding tobacco
